

## STATE HOUSE.

The debate on the Tewksbury report was concluded by the House at 12.30 Wednesday, and the majority report was accepted by a vote of 119 to 66. It was a strict party vote, except that Messrs. Barnard, Gifford, Shaw, Staples, Tyler and Wilkinson, Republicans, voted against the majority report, and Lincoln of Somerville, Democrat, voted for it.

Permission for introduction was refused to Mellen's "tanned human skin" bill. His bill for change in keeping accounts at Tewksbury was referred to the next Legislature. The bill relating to the disposition of deceased paupers were referred to a special committee to sit during the recess. The bill relating to the number of members of one family to be employed in any State institution was refused admittance. Admission was granted to a bill allowing the offices of superintendent and resident physician to be held by the same person under the approval of the Governor and council. Adjourned to Friday forenoon.
